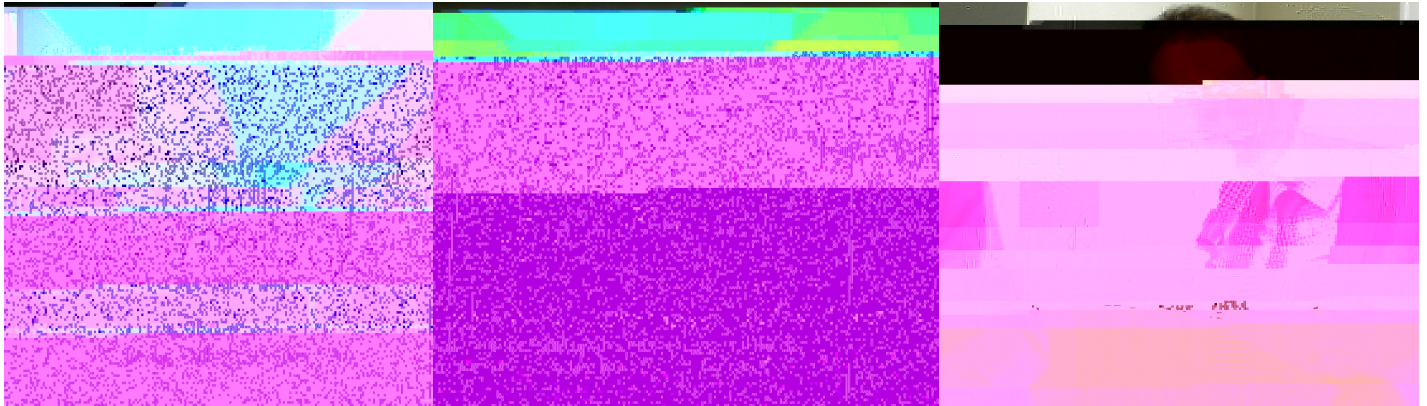
Dr. Frank Foreman reports that the Emeriti Association program for March 13 will be by Dr. Frank Foreman, Chairman of the Board of Arts and Sciences

Dr. Foreman joined Ohio University in 1963, after spending 78 years at Georgetown University, one of its four research centers. At Georgetown, he served as Associate Chairman of the Board of Arts and Sciences, as department chair of the Economics Department, as director of the doctoral program in Philosophy, Interpretation, and Culture, and as the inaugural faculty director of the Office of Universitywide Studies. He also served as program director of the Economics Program at the National Science Foundation.

Dr. Foreman earned his Ph.D. in Economics from Virginia Tech in 1935 and holds faculty appointments as professor in the departments of economics and political science. His research interest is in collective decision making, and he has published scholarly articles in the areas of voting mechanisms, public choice, law and economics, urban economics, environmental economics, econometrics, computational general equilibrium models, as well as the history of economic thought.
