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

Milburn, maker of an electric car in Toledo, Ohio, was a sedan that looked somewhat like its gasoline-burning competition, had a top speed of 17 miles per hour and a range of 17 miles on a charge. At the time, it proved a favorite especially among lawyers since there was no need for the hand crank necessary to start a gasoline engine.

Milburn put the batteries in wheel boxes to allow rapid exchange of spent batteries for charged ones at centrally located power exchanges. Doubling the number of power exchanges would have allowed for a more efficient system.
